72 days to kill the bill!

Convention on Friday morning kicked off with a video message from **AFSCME Pres. Gerald McEntee** who congratulated OCSEA delegates on getting a record 1.3 million signatures for the referendum fight in November.

Then AFSCME Secy-Treas. **Lee Saunders** addressed the crowd in person telling them that together, "we will fight like hell every single day to support working families."

While unprecedented attacks are being waged on working people across the country, Saunders said, corporations received record profits last year—an 80 percent increase, in fact. "They're pro-

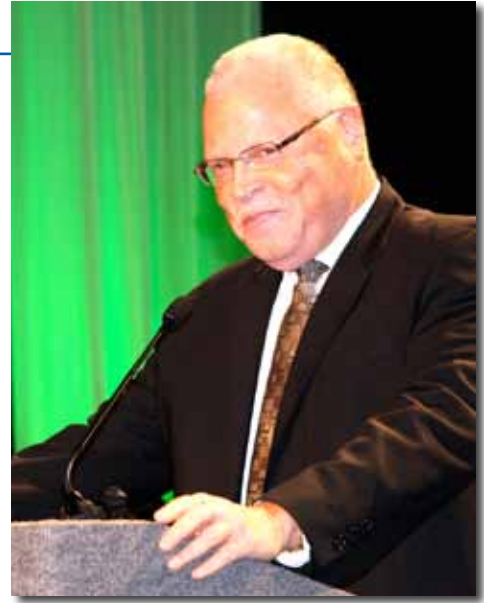
tecting their "power," not working people. And their mission is to destroy government and YOU," Saunders boomed.

"This is a coordinated campaign by **Scott Walker** and **John Kasich**, make no mistake," said Saunders. "But you have 72 days to fight for your future."

"So no matter what happens, you have the responsibility to come together at the end of this convention and fight, fight for our future," Saunders said.

Then another powerhouse from labor's ranks spoke, **Tim Burga**, Pres. of the Ohio AFL-CIO. Burga said the siege on working people will backfire and that private and public sector labor unions are going to take this fight against SB 5 and "shove it down their throats." Repeal of SB 5 will turn in to victories across this state, said Burga

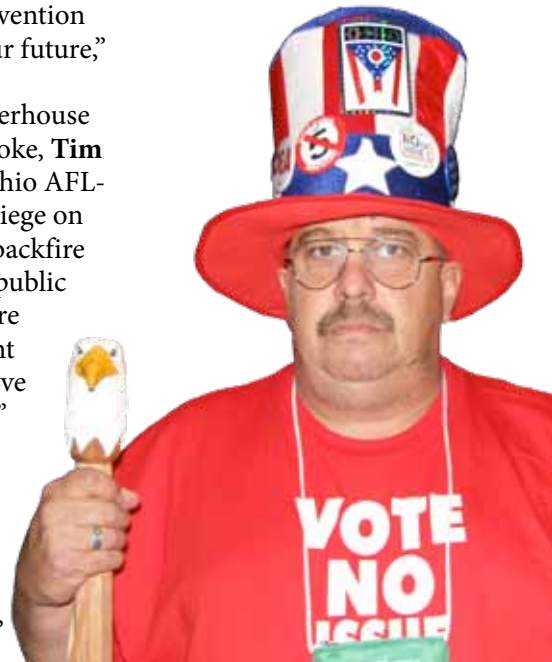
"And don't forget, Senate Bill 5 is unfair, unsafe and hurts us all," Burga said. □

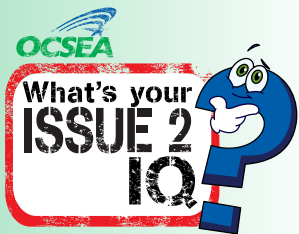
