Did you know that a new proposal will allow inmates to maintain the historic and highly visited Ohio Statehouse? Under the program, laid off employees of the Capitol Square Review and Advisory Board would be replaced with inmates who will perform groundskeeping and custodial functions at Columbus' landmark capitol building.

Consider these:

## Leave it to the professionals

State employees who maintain the Ohio Statehouse take great pride in providing custodial and groundskeeping work and ensuring that the Statehouse remains one of the most sought-after and visited landmarks in the state.

## Support working families

The employees whose jobs are being displaced with inmate labor have played by the rules. They are taxpaying citizens who contribute to Ohio's economy and to their communities. It sends the wrong message to Ohio's middle class when they are brushed aside and replaced with offenders from Ohio's prisons who have broken the rules and disregarded the law.

## Save money the right way

Employees at the Statehouse who maintain the building and grounds have been cut by 40 percent in the last several years, while the numbers of managers have remained relatively constant. Today, the ratio of managers to rank and file is nearly 1 to 1!

## Keep Ohioans safe and secure

While there are appropriate and meaningful work release and community service programs for inmates, with the number of visitors to the Statehouse each day, the environment cannot be controlled for such a program. What's more, employees who currently work at the Statehouse are being asked to oversee the prisoners, a job they didn't sign up for and have not been properly trained for.
