

Professor Robert Brookins




Professor Brookins is a Professor of Law at Indiana University and was a doctoral student at Cornell University where he taught courses in labor relations law, labor arbitration, employment discrimination, collective bargaining and employment law.

He frequently lectures and provides training sessions in employment discrimination, labor/ management

relations, alternative dispute resolution, and employment law. He is also director of the Annual Labor Management Seminar sponsored by the Indiana University School Robert H. McKinney School of Law and Region 25 of the National Labor Relations Board.

In 2011, Dennis Willard became the Communications Director of the We Are Ohio campaign that successfully fought back against Senate Bill 5, the attack on collective bargaining rights.

Before working for We Are Ohio, Dennis covered politics, policy and government as a

statehouse reporter in Columbus for 23 years, the last 15 as bureau chief for the *Akron Beacon Journal*.
